Virginia Building Code: An in-depth discussion on

history, development, and evolution of the model code

Presenter: Chris Snidow, III, P.E; Commercial Plan Review Engineer for the County of Henrico

Overview:

Building Codes are written with life-safety provisions which result in the minimum construction allowed for buildings and structures. We will be discussing the current Building Code as well as the Permit Review processes. Although Engineers of Record usually have limited interaction with this process, there are many points of interest with which they should be familiar. A discussion, which will be interactive, to explain the history leading up to the current code, code development cycles, and the evolution of the Virginia code from the model code will follow. The Virginia code will be covered in detail with emphasis on effective dates, what is and is not covered by the code, and RDP seal requirements. The Plan Review process discussion will include documents required to be submitted for review as well as code information that must be indicated on the Construction Documents. Discussion will follow about information available in Chapters 18 through 26 of the Virginia Construction Code, Special Inspections requirements, and a final mention of the Existing Building (Rehab) Code will be made.



Presenter:

Chris Snidow is currently a Commercial Plan Review Engineer for the County of Henrico. He reviews plans for Structural, Energy, Fire Rated Construction, Accessibility, and Energy compliance with the Virginia Construction Code. He received a BS degree in 1974 and a ME degree in 1979 from Virginia Tech. He has been a PE in the Commonwealth of Virginia since 1978. For almost 30 years prior to joining the County, Mr. Snidow was a designer in Private Practice for several firms in the Richmond Area. He was the lead structural engineer on several projects throughout the United States. Some of his familiar local projects were the Arthur Ashe Center, the Ballroom of the Richmond

Travel Stipends to attend the Spring 2019 Region 4 Assembly may be available from the entrant's Section and/or Branch.
